IV. RULES OF THE COURSE:

1. You are expected to behave sensibly, responsibly and have consideration for others at all times. If you are concerned about something or are in any difficulty, please talk to your Course Director, Housemaster or one of the other staff straight away.
2. You may not leave Eton or be absent from meals without the permission of your Housemaster.
3. You may not leave the immediate area of Eton College without permission from your Housemaster, unless you are on an organised trip with the group. For example, it is forbidden to cross over the bridge to Windsor or to go across the fields.
4. Silence must be maintained in your room after lights out at 10.30pm. Students must not be out of their rooms after this time.
5. The use of cigarettes, drugs, alcoholic drinks or illegal substances of any kind is absolutely forbidden at all times, and their possession alone will be enough to ensure a student's immediate return home.
6. The procedures for evacuating the House in the event of a fire will be explained shortly after your arrival. Please ensure that you understand the fire procedures and that you know what to do in the event of a fire.

V. ROAD SAFETY:

The purpose of these instructions is to make sure you are aware of the dangers of road traffic whilst you are staying in Eton and on expeditions within the UK, and to lay down safe procedures for crossing the road both for individuals and for groups, whether supervised or not.

1. English traffic drives on the left, but cars are generally driven faster in the UK than in China and not always with the same courtesy. Cars will not necessarily expect to stop to allow young people to cross the road.
2. You must find a safe place to cross. Staff will point out such places to you and you must use those on every occasion.
3. Where there is an 'island' in the middle of the road, please use this to help you to cross busy roads.

4. There is a pedestrian crossing (also called a 'Zebra Crossing' because it is black and white) opposite Bekynton. This is the only point at which the Eton Wick Road can be crossed.
5. When you are in supervised groups or when staff are present, they will organize the group and indicate when it is safe to start to cross. However, please continue to look both ways as you cross: this is especially important if you are following others across the road in what is called a 'crocodile'.
6. Please take responsibility for your own safety at all times. Don't assume that because someone has said it is safe to cross it is safe to do so, and be aware that if a group takes some time to cross a road then what seemed safe when a group starts to cross a road can rapidly become dangerous because of the speed with which cars are driven.
7. Please don't walk too many abreast on the pavements, especially where they are narrow. It is very dangerous to step off the pavement into the gutter. Remember also that there are many bicycles in Eton and that you won't necessarily hear them approach from behind. Stepping off the pavement into the gutter is the commonest cause of road accidents within Eton.
8. Never walk in the road for any other purpose than to cross it.
